



CLASS A/B LICENSE REQUIREMENT CHANGES EFFECTIVE 2/7/22

On February 7, 2022 the DMV will implement federal ENTRY LEVEL DRIVER TRAINING (ELDT) requirements for commercial driver license (CDL) applicants. ELDT must be conducted by a registered training provider listed on the Federal Training Provider Registry (TPR). ABC can help!

In addition to the federal requirements, California residents applying for an original (first time) class A or B CDL must complete a minimum of 15 hours behind-the-wheel training and submit a *California Commercial Driver Behind The Wheel Training Certificate* (DL1236) to DMV as proof of completion prior to the issuance of their CDL.

Who must comply

- First time applicants for Class A or Class B CDL
- Those upgrading from Class B to Class A CDL
- Those obtaining School Bus, Passenger or Haz Mat endorsement



How to Comply

- Attend ABC's ELDT 30-hour training course
- Participation in ABC's Class A program includes required classroom and BTW training
- Attend ABC's BTW 15 hour course



Course Details

- ELDT 30-hour classroom course
- \$500/person member
\$625/person non-member
- 15-hour BTW (behind-the-wheel training course) must show proof of previous training
- \$1750/person member
\$2250/person non-member

- **ELDT Classroom Sessions Begin every Monday and Wednesday**
- **15-hour Behind the wheel training courses must be scheduled in advance; classes begin weekly**
- **ELDT and BTW training are both covered in ABC's full Class A Course**
